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Deacon's Digest

Our Tuesday Night's bible study (*The Upward Call*) is on discipleship and is not lightweight by any means. It is based on the book by John Coblentz and deals with what it really takes to be called a disciple of Christ. It has been very informative as well, at times, quite challenging.

One hard-hitting topic that we recently covered was bitterness and forgiveness. It hit hard because it hits home, at least for me, and I believe for everyone else in our study as well. It was so powerful that I thought I'd share the highlights of what we learned so that you too, might benefit from it.

A sermon I heard recently said "There are two types of people: those who are hurting and those who will be". This is so true! We go thru many hurts thru our lives, hurts in marriage, in our childhood, in the work world, in school and even sometimes in the church.

Our lesson started out dealing with our responses to being hurt, knowing that eventually we will be. Often the first response is that of anger. Anger, in and of itself is not a sin, God even tells us to "**be angry**" in the first part of Ephesians 4:26 but the next three words say "**and sin not**". It's what we do with that anger that can lead to sin. God is clearly warning us here that where anger is, sin can be just around the corner. So to heed his warning, we need to pay close attention when we feel anger coming

on to make sure we do not cross the thin line into sin.

No matter how deeply we are wounded, we can not continue in the state of anger for very long, once we are no longer lead by our anger we often think we're over it. However, if anger was around long enough, bitterness may have set in. This is where our trouble really begins. Many people when asked, would claim that they were not bitter at all.

To help determine if you have bitterness in your life, here are a few questions to ask yourself as a sort of "check".

- "Do I keep "playing" the hurt over and over again in my mind like a broken record?"
- "Do I have a tendency to blame others?"
- "Do I feel a need to "build my case" with anyone who will listen?"

Once it is identified, you must confess it to the Lord as a sin and then ask for His forgiveness. Jesus offers us an alternative to being angry and bitter. FORGIVENESS! He asks us not only to forgive once but as many times as we are sinned against. Also He makes it clear that we will be forgiven by the Father, the same way we forgive others. (Matthew 6:14-15) As you can see, this should be of extreme importance to all of us.

In July we switched from one edition of the NIV (New International Version) translation of the Bible to another at Chapel by the Sea. The reason is that it was time to buy more Bibles, and we went shopping for the best case price. But that’s not the real story.

The real story is about why we need more Bibles. Part of the ministry at Chapel-by-the-Sea has become sharing God’s Word by giving away Bibles. In the last year alone we have given away at least 150 Bibles to people who have attended our services.

We invite people to take a Bible for their own use, to give to others, or just to leave in a visitor condo for those who come after. I was amazed when I looked through our records and found that an average of about 12 Bibles “walked” away each month over the last year. Praise God! His Word truly is “living and active.”

More reason to praise the Lord lies in the story of a 24-year-old man named Michael. Some six weeks ago, a regular attendee at Chapel-by-the-Sea requested that we all pray for a young man who had been badly injured in a car wreck on the mainland.

Youth Corner

One of my kids, not long ago, asked me, "What is the meaning of life?" I answered the question but not in its fullest. So I have taken the time to do some research on this and came up with the following information about the "meaning of life":

Dictionary:

The quality that distinguishes a vital and functional being from a dead body. The sequence of physical and mental experiences that make up the existence of an individual. Spiritual existence surpassing physical death. The period from birth to death. A specific phase of earthly existence.

The Bible:

The Bible's central concern is the paramount importance of life and how to maintain it and make it holy. The concept for the biblical view of life is the creation of man in God's image (Gen. 1:26). God blew the breath of life into the nostrils of man and man became a living being (Gen. 2:7). By this divine act man was set apart from all other creatures, to stand only a step lower than the angels (Ps. 8:5), the divine likeness serves men, not to achieve immortality, but to attain holiness.

Having been created in the divine image, one of man's tasks is the preservation of life. Since life is a divine gift, no one has the right to take either his own life or that of others (Ex. 20:13; Deut. 5:17). Life in the biblical sense means to live according to God's way which can be summarized in the command, "***You shall be holy; for I the Lord your God am holy.***" (Lev. 19:2) In Psalms and Proverbs, life is clearly connected with observing the commandment of God's laws, "***Keep my commandments and live.***" (Pro. 4:4; 7:2) To prolong one's life, it is required to fear the Lord (Pro. 10:27). Extension of days is granted to all those who keep God's statutes and commandments (Deut. 6:2).

Trust in God who sustains the world is another theme in the New Testament: "***Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?***" (Matt. 6:25; Luke 12:22-23)

More abundant life for the believer is the whole goal of the coming of Christ (Jo. 10:10). The entire gospel proves the existence of Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. Resurrection, eternal life, and faith in Christ are closely related (Jo. 20:31, 11:25-26).

Gentiles can fill their lives with the hope of salvation, which consists of being raised together with Christ (I Cor. 15:23-28; I Th. 5:15-17, 23). While Christians await Christ they have the Holy Spirit manifest in spiritual gifts (I Th. 1:10, Gal. 5:22-26). Paul urges the Christians to remain pure and blameless until the Day of the Lord (I Cor. 6:11).

The messianic aspect of waiting actively by living according to God's will is common to both Jewish and Christian traditions.

Life is Commitment:

You cannot live without committing yourself, and the more whole heartedly you commit the more you enter into the fullness of life. The Christian task today is to make Christianity visible, intelligible, and desirable.

We have to make Christianity visible to show it is the way of looking at things. We have to make Christianity intelligible by showing it makes sense of life and provides a reasonable way of living. We have to make Christianity appear desirable. We awaken a fresh consciousness of those needs and impulses of human nature which it is meant to satisfy. Therefore, it seems relevant and satisfying.

We experience life in two different ways. We experience the world thru objects open to our observation. This is the world with which science is concerned. But we also experience life as an inner awareness of being alive. Each of us must decide to which way of life we will commit ourselves. If we are not to drift aimlessly, we have to choose our pattern of life and live in accordance with it.

The real reason a person is a Christian is, in most instances, because they have seen Christ reflected in someone or because they are a member of a group which is following a way of life they know to be good. Christianity is fundamentally a life, a life in a community, a life lived, and consequently tested by the experiences which life brings. A Christian's faith, therefore, does not rest on historical evidence alone, but on what they have proved in experience to be real.

Christ means something to our world because a mighty force streams forth from Him and flows through our time also. There is a lot that could be said on the meaning of life, but it all boils down to the pure fact that without Christ we really have no fullness of life and are lost.

One little girl who was reluctant in coming to VBS, came faithfully this year and dedicated her life to Jesus! She wore a smile on her face the whole week! One of the missionaries went to the beach to watch the sunset and read her Bible and met up with a Jewish home owner and started talking to him, she got to read some Bible scriptures to him and invited him to check out the work that she was doing in Maui, VBS...and the next day he came and met up with an Evangelist who works with the Jewish community, and he asked Jesus to be LORD of his life!

(There are 2 new names in the Book of Life because of VBS, Wow!)

VBS even worked in the lives of the missionaries from Minnesota. For Ryan, this was his first missionary work and he did a great job! At first he was a bit timid but he opened up and was able

to minister to many children. For Amy it was a big change in her life as a missionary, for she got to see first hand how she could influence kids of any age and bond with them. God worked in April's life in another way, VBS helped her realize that God is in control despite our circumstances, if we are obedient to God's calling he will supply our needs and will show us exactly where to go and when, trusting on his timing and serving him always. As for Joe, the Missions Director for "*The Isaiah Connection*" it helped him to trust and believe that when God puts His desires in our hearts, God will be faithful to provide and answer His calling. In January of this year Joe felt God's calling to work with Maui but he didn't know how that would happen until Garry Thornton emailed him and asked him to help with Kihei Baptist Chapel's VBS, and that's when Joe knew that this is the answer to the calling God had given him.

DEACON'S DIGEST.....CONTINUED

If you have identified bitterness in your life, then I suggest completing the following steps as outlined in "The Upward Call":

- a. Describe the situation on paper. Tell specifically how you feel you were wronged.
- b. Lay this out before the Lord in prayer, and ask Him to show you some of His possible purposes.
- c. List these purposes as specifically as you can. Don't stop until you have listed at least ten.
- d. Write out a letter to the Lord giving Him the freedom to do all these things and any others that you have not thought about.
- e. Start a study of the Bible, collecting verses that assure you of God's sovereignty and His goodness to His children in trial. You may also find a character in the Bible who faced similar situations. Study his life until you have learned all the Lord wants to teach you. (see Romans 15:4)

f. Make a list of people who have been affected by your bitterness. Use this list as a daily prayer list. Ask yourself before you pray: How would Jesus pray for these people? Approach each prayer time with that focus.

g. If there are people on this list that you have hurt by your bitterness, purpose to clear your conscience. Confess first of all your sinful attitude. Then confess any ways you have expressed that wrong attitude. If it seems appropriate, state briefly what the Lord is teaching you.

Note: Do not attempt this step until you are sure the Lord has rooted out your bitterness and you can seek to clear your conscience *without any attempt to implicate the other party in the wrong.*

As with everything in our lives, Christ will take this burden from you if you will only let Him.

Heart attack... Congenital heart disease...these were the words that we heard over the phone from my mother-in-law a few years ago about my father-in-law. You see he was born with a defective heart, but no one realized that until external symptoms caused the doctors to look for internal problems.

Unfortunately we too were born with a congenital heart defect. And rarely do we seek any solutions to our disease until the symptoms become so severe that we realize we have an agonizing problem. The good news is we have a Father in heaven who has a good heart. He also is a great healer. He has the perfect treatment not only for our symptoms but also for our disease.

Fortunately the Lord is also a heart specialist. In I Samuel 16:7 we find that, ***"The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance but the LORD looks at the heart"***. We cannot hide anything from Him. Often times when we go to a dentist we brush our teeth very thoroughly just before we go in for an exam so that we can impress him with how well we are taking care of our teeth. In September of last year, the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR), a Muslim group, announced their plan to put books and videos in all 17,000 U.S. public libraries. According to CAIR's website, to date, they have sent close to 4,300 packages of books to our public libraries.

Should there be a Christian response? If so what should it be? I think that as Christians we MUST respond because we know the Truth. Jesus tells us plainly in John 14:6 **"I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."** We know that Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light. At the rate that Islam is spreading, demographers predict that by the year 2025, one out of four people in the world will be Muslim. We live in a world that is lost and dying without the love of Jesus. It's up to us to share the Good News with the world. After all, what were the last words that Jesus spoke to His disciples before he ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of God?

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost" (Matthew 28:19)
